Information on the tasks and activities of the Ministry of Public Administration and Justice

The Ministry of Public Administration and Justice is a body of central state administration with a special sphere of activity under Government control.

The Minister in charge of the Ministry, who is also a Deputy Prime Minister, primarily performs pan-government tasks. Specifically, the Minister coordinates government activities, the work of Ministries, is responsible for the Government's quality and HR policy, the development of central state administration and for e-public administration, and organises and supervises the implementation of the Government program titled National Cooperation Program.

In addition to the preceding pan-government tasks, the Minister is responsible for special policy tasks. These include justice policy, the representation of Hungary in international litigation, checking local governments for legal compliance, organising public administration, developing regional public administration, the professional control of the management of public documents, the regulation and management of elections and referenda, the enforcement of equal treatment, the social inclusion of people in underprivileged situations, the development of social and NGO relations, rapport with Churches and nationalities, and the professional supervision of the protection of qualified data.

The Ministry's duties include the organisation of national holidays, international press relations, and the maintenance, editing, operation and development of the Government portal (www.kormany.hu).

The Ministry promotes the work of Government and the Prime Minister by preparing decisions. Specifically, as regards the functioning of Government, the Ministry prepares Government working plans and legislative programs, supervises their implementation, participates in the preparation of Government decisions in consideration of pan-government interests, and organises Government sessions.

Given the wide range of additional tasks within his scope of competence under the relevant laws, the Minister supervises several bodies of central state administration with the involvement of ministers of state, and performs extensive legislative activities.
