Born on 10 August 1941 in Budapest. Studied in Budapest, and took his secondary-school leaving exam at ELTE Apáczai Csere János Grammar School.

Started his university studies in 1959 at the Budapest University of Technology, and continued his studies at Eötvös Loránd University of Sciences, Faculty of Science.

Graduated as a secondary-school teacher of geography and biology in 1965, and

in 1966 was qualified as a cartographer.

Defended his university doctoral dissertation in 1967,

his candidate dissertation in 1978.

and his Doctor of the Hungarian Academy dissertation in 1992.

Eventually, habilitated in 1994.

Has been teaching at Eötvös Loránd University since 1965:

Teaching assistant from 1965 until 1966.

assistant lecturer between 1966 and 1971.

senior lecturer from 1971 until 1980,

and associate professor from 1980 to 1994.

Head of the Cartography Department between 1987 and 1995,

in 1994 was appointed to be full professor.

Head of the Environmental Physics Department Group between 1995 and 2000.

In 2003 got the title 'professor' at the Andrássy Gyula German Speaking University.

## Teaching career:

His teaching career has covered all the fields in cartography (giving and organising various lecture courses and field practices for students of cartography, geography, geology, meteorology, archaeology and mesology). His professional activities and researches, however, are focused on the main area of thematic cartography. 76 theses, 14 university doctoral and 7 PhD dissertations were prepared under his mentorship, and he coordinated the work of 5 doctoral students (candidates).

Being the leader of the cartography programme at the Doctoral School of Geography and Earth Studies, has directed and is directing 18 doctoral candidates' studies.

In 1997 and 1998 all four leading teachers at the Department (all of them being his former students) gained the Széchenyi Professor Scholarship.

### Academic career, awards, degrees:

Started his scientific career in the 1970s by studying the visualisation methodology issues of thematic cartography, and continued his research in the field of automatisation. In the 1980s and 1990s participated in several Hungarian and international cooperations through editing thematic maps and by developing the COMAPO and DIASIG map-preparation techniques. Since the beginning of the 1990s, has been carrying out research work, under international coordination, in the field of scientific history.

Since 1999 has been granted the Széchenyi Professor Scholarship.

Became member of the German Academy of Sciences Leopoldina in 2000, (from 2009 on the German National Academy)

honourable member of the International Cartographic Association (ICA) from 2003. Became corresponding member of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences (MTA) in 2004, whereas from 2010 on has been a full member of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences.

#### **Publications:**

His findings have been published in approximately 123 publications and 12 technical books or in chapters of technical books, and he contributed to the editing work of 6 technical atlases and 9 maps.

and in 1976 performed research work for a longer term at the Friedrich Wilhelm University Bonn, and in 1980 at the University of Vienna.

In recent years has paid visits to foreign universities as a university guest lecturer (Berlin, Karlsruhe, Munich, Utrecht) and took part in conferences as an invited participant (Berlin, Bournemuth, Coburg, Dresden, Enschede, Hamburg, Karlsruhe, Cologne, Lisbon, Rostock, Trier, Utrecht) 23 times altogether.
