Relevance and Scope of the Report

□ The report was **submitted to the Council of Ministers on 17**th **June last** and contains **the main actions taken by the Central State Administration** during the period 2009-2011 **related** (directly or indirectly) **to** facilitate the creation, development and growth **of small and medium-sized companies.**



Characteristics of the Report

It is structured around the ten principles of the SBA

Ten chapters of evaluation, one for each principle of the SBA

Cooperation between a number of ministries

It has involved all the ministries with some impact on SMEs

Conclusions of the Report (1) *entrepreneurial initiative*

Great efforts are being made to promote **entrepreneurial initiative**:

- Development of the entrepreneurial spirit is present in curricula at all levels of education (primary, secondary, vocational training, university)
- Pilot plans for financial education initiatives at all stages of education
- Campaigns to promote entrepreneurial initiative
- Promoting self-employment, cooperatives and worker-owned business
- Promoting entrepreneurial initiative among women



Conclusions of the Report (2)

entrepreneurial initiative

Many programmes provide financial support to entrepreneurship

- ✓ ENISA finance for entrepreneurs
- ICO-Entrepreneurs finance line
- CERSA guarantees for company start-ups
- Micro credits for women entrepreneurs and businesswomen
- Support for Business Angels networks
- Finance for cultural and creative industries
- CDTI grants for creating and consolidating technology-based companies



Conclusions of the Report (3) *entrepreneurial initiative*

A wide range of advisory services for entrepreneurs:

- ✓ There are 2,866 entrepreneur support platforms described in the report entitled "Support services to enterprising individuals" drawn up by the SME Observatory
- Entrepreneurial Continuity Plan
- Information and Advice for Women Entrepreneurs and Businesswomen
- On-line tutoring and training for young entrepreneurs
- Training programme for entrepreneurs in the cultural field



Conclusions of the Report (4) *entrepreneurial initiative*

Setting up limited companies with capital of between 3,100 and 30,000 Euros (98% of which are set up) takes **5 days and has a maximum cost of 250 Euros**

□ If the company capital is less than 3,100 Euros, the procedure takes one day and the cost is 100 Euros



Conclusions of the Report (5) *e-Government*

□ 97% of procedures with the General State Administration accessible on the internet

78% of public procurement accessible on line

□ A State Register of Tenderers helps companies to participate in public calls for tender,

□Each Ministry has its own official website where the public can access all the latest on-line information and services provided



Conclusions of the Report (6) *European Services Directive Transposition*

□ 50 State Laws, 118 Royal Decrees and 21 Ministerial Orders were amended as part of the transposition of the European Services Directive

□116 authorisations in the State area, 633 in the Autonomous Communities and 594 requirements have been removed

□The estimated cost of charges thus removed is 1.7 billion €/year

□ The virtual one-stop shop WWW.EUGO.ES (in a network with EU countries) provides information on procedures for exercising a services activity in Spain and gives help in dealing with the necessary steps



Conclusions of the Report (7) *Financial support to SME*

Significant efforts made to provide financial support to SMEs

- ✓ More than 80 billion € facilitated to ME between 2009 and 2011 [ICO lines (88% of the total)]
- ✓ Shareholder loans granted via ENISA
- SME securitisation funds programme (FTPYME)
- CERSA counterguarantees for SMEs
- ✓ Sustainable Economy Fund (**FESpyme**)



Conclusions of the Report (8)

□ Fiscal-type measures to support SMEs adopted in the period 2009-2011 provided aid to the tune of 9 billion Euros

□Training support and improving competitiveness programmes involved 4 billion Euros

- Restructuring declining industrial zones
- Improving the competitiveness of strategic sectors
- ✓ AVANZA (TIC)
- ✓ INNCORPORA (innovation)



It is useful for three reasons:

- 1. **To meet our information commitments** to the European Commission.
- 2. To draw up a **balance of the actions performed** in Spain for SMEs since the adoption of the SBA in December 2008.
- 3. **To establish a basis for further and continuous improvement on** the application of the Small Business Act (SBA) in Spain.



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
