Smart Cities Portfolio Priorities

- Smart Cities Portfolio launched: Helsinki conference, Nov. 2010
- Currently developing the workplan of the Smart Cities Portfolio Working Group: City of Manchester is Chair
- Work in partnership with Eurocities, ENoLL, FIA and other networks to promote Smart Cities and plan collaborative work, including knowledge exchange
- Communications plan being developed in partnership with the European Commission
- Exploiting projects' links with key decision makers at city, regional, national and international level



Eurocities Smart Cities Network

- Eurocities founded in 1986 and its Brussels office opened in 1992
- Telecities founded in 1993 and first EC funded "European Digital Cities" project (94-96 - FP4)
- led to further projects:
 - TEN-Telecom project 'InfoCities' (96-98)
 - IntelCity Roadmap project (FP5 2002-3)
 - Intelligent Cities project (FP6 2004-6)
- Telecities became Eurocities Knowledge Society Forum (KSF) in 2005
- Manchester was a founding member of Telecities and the Living Labs network (2006) which became the European Network of

Living Labs (ENoLL)

 Eurocities KSF launched its Smart Cities working group in April 2011, co-chaired by Manchester and Barcelona (both leads for EU
